


Few people talk about the story behind the story. Although full of well-intentioned and deeply committed people, the overburdened foster care and child welfare systems cannot begin to meet the needs of over 690,000 children in foster care in the United States.

It is the story of a six-year-old girl who has been moved to six group homes and three schools over the past two years. The story of a toddler separated from her brothers and sisters during the most vulnerable time in her life. The story of a child being handed all his belongings in a plastic bag at the age of 18, because he has "aged out" of the system.

It is a story that occurs over and over again in America's foster care and child welfare system.

Changing a child's story is possible because a group of trained volunteers, appointed by judges, advocate for these children until their case is closed and they reach a safe, permanent home. Volunteers work with legal and child welfare professionals, educators and others to ensure that judges have all the information they need to make potentially life-changing decisions for each child. These stories have better endings because of people like you.

We are Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children, a volunteer-powered network of committed people—from all walks of life—who believe society has a fundamental obligation to these children. We are people just like you who believe that every child has the right to be treated with dignity, to be safe, and to thrive in the embrace of a loving family.
